

MEDIA RELEASE: ELDER ABUSE

Aged Rights Advocacy Service Inc (ARAS) acknowledges the deeply distressing case of physical assault and elder abuse on Mr Hausler which was revealed on the 7.30 Report.

ARAS will continue to work with the Hausler family to resolve care issues.

ARAS CEO, Carolanne Barkla says 'ARAS will also advocate for change that supports older people to exercise their rights, particularly in regard to the right to privacy, dignity, and safety'.

It is important to acknowledge that there are many diligent and caring staff of residential aged care facilities who support older people everyday.

ARAS has also been approached as to what staff, residents, representatives, family or friends should do if they suspect a family member living in residential aged care is being abused.

If Staff, residents or their representatives have concerns:

- They should raise those concerns with the Residential Aged Care Facility in the first instance.
- If they are not happy with the response they should contact the Aged Care Complaints Commissioner and /or seek the support of an ARAS Advocate.
